The Shine ministry continues to thrive with God's blessing! Our 24 dedicated volunteers ensure that our participants can enjoy Sunday mornings, weeknights, and retreat activities for ages 2 through adulthood. Additionally, our 25+ families continue to take root throughout the church and ministries weekly. On Sunday mornings, we continue to attend to our Shine individuals, focusing on individualized teaching of Bible content utilizing accommodative techniques. We provided specialized expert training to our volunteers and families through innovative professional resources. We continue our partnership with St. Catherine Center for Special Needs. St. Catherine volunteers come to Black Rock each week and do simple odd jobs to help clean the church. Currently, we are trialing new ways to integrate our participants into their age-appropriate church activities when provided with buddy support. Soon, we will be offering related content in the bookstore! We thank the congregation and the church leaders for their unwavering support as we enter our 9th year as a ministry! BLACK ROCK KIDS

We are thrilled to share the success of our Kids Ministry over the past year, filled with engaging activities and impactful lessons. Some of the highlights include: 260 kids participating in Sunday morning activities, 50 families engaging in online programming, 85 kids attending Wednesday night sessions, 330 kids enjoying our Summer Adventure camp, 800 attendees at The Amazing Chemistry Show, 210 individuals partaking in the Christmas Gingerbread Bash, and 30 kids participating in the Christmas choir. We welcomed 370 new kids with a 60% retention rate! Our Shine Ministry, catering to children with varying abilities, is expanding to meet the increasing demand.


We continue to partner with families through parent courses, family events, and weekly resources. Our kids love memorizing Bible verses, exploring God's Word, and engaging in worship. We're so thankful for the hard work and influence of our 100+ adult and teen volunteers who make a huge difference in our children's lives every week. As our ministry grows, we're seeking additional volunteers to help shape the future generation. STUDENT MINISTRY

Our Student Ministry has aimed to produce students who are passionate and resilient followers of Jesus. Each week, we had the privilege of hosting about 135 high school and middle school students. This year, we gave Bibles to 30 students who committed to follow Jesus all the days of their lives and decided to be baptized. Throughout 2023, we saw students get excited to pray for one another during our two retreats and in their small groups. Several of our high schoolers have met together for a student-led Bible study on Ecclesiastes. Our middle schoolers have frequently shown up to do yard work for those in need in our community. Fifteen of our middle school students went on a mission trip with The Hartford Project while our high school students served in the Dominican Republic. On Sunday mornings, our students serve in many areas of the church including the cafe, parking team, Kids Ministry, and Shine Ministry. Join us as we pray for God to do even more in this next year!





SANCTUARY

We're so thankful for a wonderful ministry year at Sanctuary. Ignite (our college-aged ministry), led by Treadwell Lewis, has flourished in the past two years growing from six people in 2021 to an average attendance of 40 this past year! Statistics show that Gen Z is leaving the church in droves across the country, but God continues to pour out His goodness on us as we experience the opposite of the statistics in our community. God is moving powerfully on local university campuses, bringing spiritually hungry and expectant young people to our service and our events. This year continued the trend of breaking last year's previous record for the highest attended Sanctuary retreat yet (170 young adults)! Thank you for praying for the young adults in CT, and please continue to pray as we send our first team out to the mission field (Dominican Republic) since the pandemic.

SERVING

This year our Serving Teams have seen continued momentum with an average of 16 NEW volunteers onboarded each month. We currently have 729 adults and teens serving on a regular basis with 75 active teams. Our focus for the upcoming year will be the renovation of serving structures and systems to better equip these saints for the work of ministry and empower more volunteer leaders to fully shepherd their teams. Two key areas that we are intentionally developing this year are Next Steps and our new Translation Team as both are essential to facilitating the integration of more people into our discipleship process.

Not only are our teams meeting the tangible needs of our congregation, but they are deepening in their love and service of each other which benefits all of us. Serving on a team is a great way to enjoy fellowship and grow in your faith as you serve the body of Christ. If you're not yet on a team, we'd love to hear from you and help you make that connection!





THANKSGIVING BLESSING BAGS

In October and November, our church family comes together to provide 100s of Thanksgiving Blessing Bags. Each bag gives a family everything they need to create a delicious holiday meal that lasts for several days. Black Rock members actively participate by picking up their bags and filling them with food from our packing list. Many of these meals are hand-delivered to Black Rock families in need, while others come back to the church for transport to our local partners. Last year, over 1200 Blessing Bags were collected and distributed to deserving people. It was a heartwarming family affair as our students prayed over and helped with the collection of bags. This year, our planning team is exploring new ways to increase this service to our church and community. It is a privilege to serve with Jesus followers, who are filled with generosity. Together, we are making a big difference in the lives of people who need to connect with God's love in a tangible way, and we are united in our compassion for others.

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP

Adult Discipleship is all about helping our church learn and live as followers of Jesus. Connecting Intentionally with Others is one of our core Wholehearted Jesus-follower values, and scores of Black Rockers live this out through our various Group opportunities. Over 300 adults participated in a Topic Group this year to build a foundation of faith in groups like Christianity Explored or What Is the Gospel while others grew in a particular area of interest such as the book of Revelation. Participation in Living Free Groups for support remains strong, and Community Groups are expanding with new leaders forming more groups after taking part in our Equipping for Biblical Community training and exploration group. As our church family has expanded and includes more language backgrounds than ever before, we formed a new serving team - the Translators Team - to help provide language assistance. These volunteers are strategic within the Welcome Center on Sunday mornings and at connecting opportunities like Open House. They will also work behind the scenes to translate brochures, Community Group resources, and other printed material to better serve our church family.



SPAIN MISSION TRIP

In October 2023, a short-term team traveled from Black Rock to Malaga, Spain, to support our Global Partners, Emil and Sarah. What began as a mission to love and encourage Emil + Sarah and their ministry partners resulted in something miraculous in so many ways. We never know what God has in store for us unless we first answer his call to "Go!" On this trip, God blessed us by sharing His heart for the migrants and refugees from other lands to reside among us. He uses the movement of people to accomplish His greater purpose, which is to expand His Kingdom. By loving and welcoming migrants and refugees, we, the church, not only carry out the Great Commandment to love our neighbors, but we also fulfill the Great Commission to proclaim the gospel to the nations. That God moved our hearts on this trip was evident upon our return. Several Malaga team members reached out to the missions staff at Black Rock to discuss long-term mission opportunities. We praise God for inviting us to participate in His mission to the world.



CAR CARE

Last year, Black Rock Cares continued to provide oil changes, safety checks, and essential vehicle maintenance to families in our church and community. We are grateful to Albert Choi and the Ein Gedi Spring Gulf Station. Our partnership has allowed us to offer this service year-round, regardless of the weather. A faithful team of volunteers, led by a Care Leadership Team member (deacon), meets at the Gulf Station on the first Saturday of each month. Those who take advantage of this service and don't attend Black Rock are given a Bible with a list of ways to connect at BRC. This has also led to great faith discussions. During 2023, our volunteer team serviced nearly 50 vehicles, including referrals from the Town of Fairfield. We also provided several families with safe transportation through our car donation program. This year, we need more donated cars, more people to help in the garage, and the capacity for many more appointments. Your involvement is crucial! We look forward to sharing the good news that Black Rock cares about the practical needs of people, including their cars, and we value your contribution to our community!

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community Engagement has continued to grow and thrive in the last year! God is opening doors for us to build relationships with our neighbors, support those in need in our community, and share the good news with those we meet along the way. We have been able to complete service projects around Fairfield County with the team that shows up each Second Saturday. When we host a Fifth Sunday collection, our church has generously responded to stock our Local Partners with the supplies that they need. We have also increased our support for our Local Partners by providing training and investing more volunteer presence. We are so thankful for the growth we've seen since the launch of Community Engagement. As we look ahead, we are asking God for deep roots to support the work ahead.

SENIOR **PASTOR**

Black Rock Church began in 1849, so in January we declared 2024 a celebration of God's faithfulness to Black Rock over 175 years! To commemorate this in our worship services, Pastor Josh and I preached a sermonseries we called "Timeless Truths for Truthless Times."

In God's providence, it so happens that Black Rock's 175th anniversary coincides with my final year of ministry, after nearly 30 years as Senior Pastor and 40 years as a Black Rock staff member. For this, my last Senior Pastor report, I'd like to reference the 6 "Timeless Truths" in order to connect the great things happening now—to the even greater things ahead.

"God's Word Is the Final Word"

For 175 years, Black Rock has committed itself to Jesus' view of Scripture, and this is what sets Black Rock apart from the surrounding landscape of many dying churches. In contrast, this past year, our worship attendance grew by 25% as more and more people keep coming to know God through His authoritative Word.

"Jesus Is THE Way to Life"

Black Rock stands on the words of Jesus, "I am the way, the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father except through me." This year, our baptism services were once again at capacity with people testifying how through our ministries to kids, students, and adults, they found Jesus--the only way to life.

"It's All about Souls"

Jesus gave us a mission as a church—and our mission is to help people near and far receive eternal life for their eternal souls by believing and growing in Jesus. This passion animates our Local and Global Mission programs which continue to grow with impact and effectiveness.

"Made to Make a Difference"

Scripture calls Black Rock to "equip the saints for works of ministry." This year, we introduced the "6 Values of a Wholehearted Jesus Follower." The Values cover topics like worship, prayer, Bible study, and community—all designed to equip Black Rockers as mature servants of Jesus.

"Jesus Is THE Way to Joy"

Jesus is neither slavish legalism nor selfish consumerism—Jesus is the way to true JOY. There is true joy at Black Rock and it's contagious! Over this past year, we had over 600 guests register interest in connection at Black Rock. Over and over, our guests say how they were drawn in by the sense of joy and love among the people of our church.

If Jesus has not yet returned, then 175 years from now Black Rock must be a faithful witness by continually passing a vibrant relationship with Jesus to the next generation. For this reason, I'm so thankful for this year's opening of the Black Rock Growth Center, which is dedicated to promoting Christ-following among our students by offering them muchneeded counseling resources.

I'm happy to say that 175 years after its founding. Black Rock Church is strong, healthy, and fully committed to these 6 Timeless Truths. Black Rock Church is a bright light for Jesus in New England—and as we continue to be faithful, there's no doubt that Black Rock's future is even brighter! I'm so thankful that God called me to serve Black Rock Church. Most pastors don't get to spend their entire career at one church—but then again, most pastors wouldn't want to if they could! I wanted to spend my entire career at Black Rock because there are no better people to do life with-anywhere. And if I had to choose where to minister over again—every time—I'd ask God to send me to Black Rock Church.

EXECUTIVE **PASTOR**

Our vision at Black Rock Church is:

To Ignite Faith and Inspire Hope in everyone we meet by connecting to God through Jesus.

As Executive Pastor, I love planning and praying through how we accomplish this Godgiven vision. I love asking questions like, "How do we introduce more people to the loving salvation that comes through a relationship with Jesus Christ?" or "How do we help the thousands of people who attend Black Rock Church live out the joyful fullness that comes from wholeheartedly following Jesus with our entire lives?"

This year, we were able to dig deeply into these vision questions after nearly four years of being impacted by the pandemic. Much of our ministry during the pandemic focused on supporting and serving our congregation and community during a massive crisis. It was a privilege to be a stabilizing and uplifting force during those years of crisis, pointing people to the peace, hope, and joy of a relationship with Jesus. There are still ramifications to the pandemic, but we are seeing people hungry for greater growth and discipleship.

Our Sunday services are overflowing, causing great "problems" with no spare parking and limited seating. We had over 600 guests coming through our doors and experiencing the love of Christ. We often hear statements like, "The moment I walked in, I felt something different." We know they are feeling the power of the Holy Spirit and the love of Christian community.

God brings people to a saving faith in Jesus almost every Sunday at Black Rock Church. People come from various religious, ethnic, racial, and socioeconomic backgrounds. This year, we defined six values of a Wholehearted Jesus-Follower that help us explain what it looks like to have a dynamic, growing relationship with God. Once someone puts their faith in Jesus, we get to spend the rest of

our lives building that relationship by:

- Worshiping in a Service
- Connecting Intentionally with Others
- Serving on a Team
- Dialoguing with God through Prayer
- Knowing God through Scripture
- Sharing our Resources & Faith Story

This year, our staff placed a major emphasis on equipping and shepherding volunteers. As Ephesians 4:12 says, the church should "equip the saints for the work of ministry." We want to shepherd our church into a growing relationship with God and a healthy relationship with others. We want to equip them to be successful in their specific volunteer roles at church. As our church grows, we encourage attendees to step into their God-given role of serving God through serving others.

Our church and staff are strong as we head into an exciting year of transition at Black Rock. We are strongly rooted in God's love, the foundational truth of Scripture, and Christlike character through the Holy Spirit. I look forward to what God will do in and through Black Rock Church in the future.

Black Rock is blessed to be part of God's Great Commission work throughout the world. We are grateful to be a church that is committed to praying, giving, and going. March 9-17, we hosted several of our global partners during our 67th Annual Missions Week, a highlight of the year at Black Rock. Throughout the week, you were encouraged to pray, give, and go. Currently, more than 1,000 Black Rock attendees are committed to **praying** for one or more of our global partners. This year, 175+ new prayer partners joined our force of BRC prayer partners. Thank you! Because of your faithful giving throughout the year, the Board of Missions is able to consider several end-of-year financial gifts that will help our partners with ministry and personal needs like computer updates, moving expenses, language school, car repairs, etc. You will hear more about year-end grants in upcoming Missions in Action posts and other reports. Praise God for His generosity.

This past year, the Lord called two of Black Rock's own to **go**. (1) Ben Tobben who grew up at Black Rock, is serving at the University of Maryland with Cru. Ben has a heart to walk with UMD students "through whatever circumstances they find themselves in and point them to Christ in everything." (2) Sue Perkins, in her words, had a "radical encounter with Jesus at Black Rock the summer of 2018." After going on several BRC mission trips, she felt called to serve the Lord in Nigeria. Her passion is to share the Good News and inspire hope among hurting and broken Nigerian women. In September of 2023, we were privileged to commission her. In November, she left for Nigeria because of your faithful praying and giving. Praise God for His goodness.

On Wednesday evening of our 2024 Missions Week, Lanre Williams-Ayedun joined us to celebrate our 20 th anniversary of partnership with World Relief in Rwanda. World Relief was one of the first organizations to enter Rwanda following the end of the genocide

in 1994. With Black Rock's support, the focus region of Nyamasheke District has undergone remarkable transformation resulting from initiatives like Church Empowerment Zones (CEZ) which led to holistic development, empowerment of individuals, and significant reduction in extreme poverty. CEZs helped strengthen families, provide intervention for kids, and establish savings groups where members save money and borrow to finance their businesses. In 20 years' time, the Lord brought healing and restoration; World Relief no longer considers it necessary to maintain a presence there. Praise God for His love and care.

Over the past 20 years, close to 100 Black Rock attendees have **gone** to serve with BRC short term teams to Rwanda, made possible because you **prayed** and **gave**. This past year, we sent a middle school team to Hartford, a high school team and an adult team to the Dominican Republic, and adult teams to Kazakhstan, Nigeria, Florida, and Honduras, made possible because you **prayed** and **gave**. Praise God for His faithfulness.

May our loving heavenly Father find us faithful. May He continue to grow us in our obedience to **pray**, **give**, and **go**. We praise His mighty name for the work He is doing throughout the world. Black Rock is blessed to be part of God's Great Commission work.



DAN SCRIBNER


