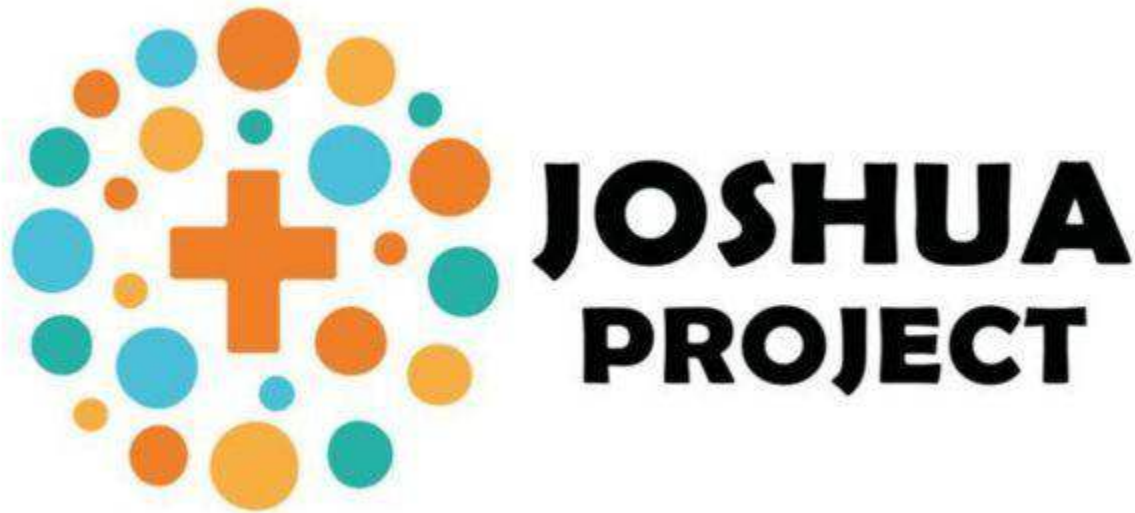


Joshua Project Helps Mobilize Indigenous Christians for Missions



This year, Dan Scribner of Joshua Project, is one of our Spotlight Partners. He has served with the U.S. Center for World Mission / Frontier Ventures for 36 years and been one of our Black Rock Partners since 2005. Joshua Project's focus is to highlight the least reached peoples and places so the Body of Christ can prioritize its prayer and mission efforts.

Two-thirds of visitors to Joshua Project's website are now from outside North America so a key challenge is adapting the presentation of unreached people groups to the growing Church and missions movement in the Global South. Future missionaries may come from Nigeria, Brazil, and even China and India. To explore how to best serve this global community, Joshua Project created a survey for users and stakeholders to help shape their path forward. In his most recent newsletter, Dan mentions that the focus on people groups in missions is often traced to Dr. Ralph Winter's 1974 Lausanne address.
