Vision: Inspire hope and ignite faith in every person we meet by connecting them to God through Jesus.



BLACK ROCK KIDS

We're overjoyed to reflect on another year of strong growth and spiritual development within our Kids Ministry. Approximately 285 kids attended Kids Church weekly, while 65 families connected online, extending our reach. Kids Midweek nurtured 95 young hearts, deepening biblical truths and building connections. Summer Adventure camp brought faith-filled fun and friendships to 385 children. The Amazing Chemistry Show captivated 910 attendees, sparking curiosity and wonder, and 220 families shared the joy of building gingerbread nativities and creating meaningful memories. 30 children sang in the Christmas Choir, celebrating the birth of Jesus. We welcomed 580 new children, with a 60% retention rate, a testament to our welcoming community. Our Shine Ministry, dedicated to children with varying abilities, continues to flourish, ensuring every child feels valued, included, and loved regardless of ability.

We are committed to partnering with families, providing resources, and engaging family activities to strengthen faith at home and support parents. Our children are growing spiritually, memorizing scripture, delving into biblical stories, and expressing faith through worship. Our 150+ dedicated adult and teen volunteers are the heart of our ministry, and their passion impacts children's lives. As we anticipate further growth, we pray for more volunteers to join us in leading children to Jesus, cultivating lasting friendships, and being part of our awesome and growing community.





SHINE - SPECIAL NEEDS

As we enter our 10th year as a ministry, we are excited that our families have taken root throughout the church and various ministries. We continue to serve individuals ages 2 through adulthood and have begun to transition individuals who are ready to enjoy Sunday school with their peers when given 1:1 support from one of our trained 20+ volunteers. Our focus on Sunday morning is to have individualized teaching of Bible content utilizing accommodative techniques. Over the past 9 years, we have grown from 3 to 35+ beautiful individuals under our care. A highlight of this past year was an informational seminar we hosted here at the church featuring advice from Attorney Kathleen M. Dunn of Stratford and Fairfield's probate judge, the honorable Katherine E. Caulfield. This event provided our Shine parents with key knowledge to navigate the complex administrative and legal processes these families face in their quardianship roles as their children reach the age of 18. We followed up with a highly informative Q&A with SHINE parents, Dave and Sue! We also continued our partnership with St. Catherine Center for Special Needs, where a team of industrious young students comes to BRC to perform various weekly cleaning and organizing tasks! Thank you for your unwavering support and prayers!



STUDENT MINISTRY

Our Student Ministry has aimed to produce students who are passionate and resilient followers of Jesus. This school year, we hosted 207 high school students and 144 middle school students during our midweek programming. We had 114 total students attend Deep End, our Sunday morning programming for middle school. So far this year, we've seen 18 students get baptized, committing to follow God all the days of their lives, and we've provided them with high-quality study Bibles. We also had 316 students join us on our Fall and Winter retreats this year. Our high school servant leadership team, which started meeting this year, has independently decided to run a biweekly Bible study. Our middle schoolers helped pack Thanksgiving blessing bags and do yard work for those in need in our community. Twenty-seven of our students had the opportunity to go on two mission trips with The Hartford Project. On Sunday mornings, our students serve in many areas of the church, including the cafe, parking team, Kids Ministry, and Shine Ministry. Join us as we pray for God to do even more in this next year!

SANCTUARY (Young Adults)

We're so thankful for a wonderful ministry year at Sanctuary. We are over the moon with excitement to have Andres Ayala join our team to lead Ignite (our college ministry). Statistics show that Gen Z is leaving the church in droves across the country, but God continues to pour out His goodness on us as we experience the opposite of those statistics at Ignite. God is moving powerfully on local university campuses, bringing spiritually hungry and expectant young people to our community. Thank you for praying for our young adults to have a heart for sharing the gospel. Those prayers resulted in successfully sending our first missions team to the Dominican Republic last June and our follow-up trip this June! Thank you for praying for the young adults in CT. Please continue to pray that their spiritual hunger will lead them to Jesus.





SERVING

This year, our Serving Teams have continued to gain momentum, with over 40 new volunteers joining. We now have 766 adults and teens serving regularly across 75 active teams. As we look ahead, we're excited about the opportunities that the addition of a fourth worship service brings, creating new ways for those who haven't yet stepped into serving to get involved.

Another key area of growth is our Translation Team. Please join us in prayer as this team expands and strengthens to serve the increasing diversity that God has graciously brought into our congregation.

Not only are our teams meeting the tangible needs of our church, but they are also growing in love and service toward one another, enriching our entire community. Serving on a team is a meaningful way to experience fellowship, deepen your faith, and use your gifts to bless the body of Christ. If you're not yet part of a team, we'd love to connect with you and help you find your place!

THANKSGIVING BLESSING BAGS

One of the ways that we provide needed support to our church and the community is through our Thanksgiving Blessing Bags initiative. Through the generosity of our church, over 1,000 bags were distributed to deserving Black Rock families and Community Engagement Partners such as Bridgeport Rescue Mission, Operation Hope, and Pivot Ministries. Each bag provides a family with everything needed to create a holiday meal that lasts for several days. Blessing Bags are hand-delivered to families or come back to the church for transport to our local partners. Our Student Ministry was also involved by helping to collect and pray over each bag. Our church is making a huge difference in the lives of people who connect with Jesus' love in a tangible way as we demonstrate our love for them.

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP

Adult Discipleship fosters opportunities for people to experience what it means to believe in Jesus as their Savior, surrender to knowing and living according to His word, and grow in their relationship with God. New Guest Connections staff Kerrie Butterfield and Amparo Ulloa helped over 750 people be welcomed to Black Rock for the first time and be guided toward discipleship steps this year.

Our translation serving team continues to expand our reach by making our discipleship resources accessible in multiple languages.

A pivotal moment in the life of a Christ-follower is baptism, symbolizing new life through Jesus. A record number of people took that step this year, leading to the addition of a third baptism Sunday service! This testimony excerpt summarizes the heart behind Adult Discipleship:

"...I had little church background and was intimidated by my lack of knowledge about the Bible. By participating in multiple Topic Groups, the pieces started coming together. I now believe that Jesus is the Messiah the Bible talks about, and I trust in Him to forgive my sins and for everlasting life and relationship with God...I have hope...The anger I had toward God, and others, is gone. I have learned to love others as I am loved."

NAMIBIA MISSION TRIP

This past year, we launched our first mission trip to Namibia with a diverse team of 14 participants from different generations, languages, and cultures. Ages ranged from under 10 to over 50, and our backgrounds included Brazilian, Colombian, French, and Namibian heritages. Our mission took us to Rundu, where we taught and encouraged church leaders from Namibia, Angola, and Botswana. We also shared Jesus' love with children from local youth facilities. As pioneers in a new region, we relied on the Holy Spirit's guidance. Despite our planning, it was God who led us through unexpected encounters and divine moments. After serving, we marveled at God's creation on a safari in Etosha National Park, reflecting on what He had accomplished in and through us. Our first Namibia mission trip was a powerful reminder of God's faithfulness. As we look ahead, we trust that God will continue opening doors for us to impact lives. We invite you to prayerfully consider how God might be calling you to serve on a mission trip and join us in spreading His love across the globe.

A Historic Transition

This journey challenged us to examine our beliefs in light of Black Rock's Statement of Faith, strengthening our spiritual foundation. As we **BELIEVE** in the fundamental truths of Scripture, we cultivate **BEHAVIORS** that deepen our relationship with God, transforming us into people who **BECOME** more like Christ, bearing the fruit of the Spirit.



Record-Breaking Growth

This year, our average Sunday attendance grew by nearly 500 people, making it the highest-attended year in our church's history. CARE MINISTRY

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." (Galatians 6:9, NIV)

In 2024, Black Rock Cares "reap(ed) a harvest" through people, with whom our teams were able to partner, who experienced breakthroughs in their lives. One such family came to the Deacons unable to pay expenses for a loved one's funeral. The team helped with these fees and provided other support, including a referral to our financial coaching team. Today, this family owns its own business, serves in our church, and regularly gives to the Deacons Fund. Another individual started coming to Black Rock during a family member's terminal illness and actually attended a service on the weekend she passed away. Months later, he hadn't missed even one Sunday at BRC. I mentioned to him how unusual it was for a grieving person to be so faithful. His response brought tears to my eves: "Pastor Gaylord, why would I choose to be anywhere else? From the moment I stepped through the doors, I've experienced nothing but acceptance, love, and support from my church!" If space allowed, I could share more stories.

Last year, your sacrificial gifts to the Deacons Fund (breakdown on a separate page) allowed Black Rock Cares to "reap a harvest" by helping scores of people with their tangible needs. Our church family mobilized to contribute over 1,000 Thanksgiving Blessing Bag meals to BRC families and our Community Engagement partners. Your generosity enabled us to give \$7,500 to church parents to purchase Christmas gifts for their children. Your devotion to our mission also helped us assist many people with car donations and maintenance, cards and other personal contacts, counseling, financial coaching, food assistance, funeral services, home/hospital/retirement facility visits, and other important care services.

I'm so thankful for our Deacons Team, which stewards the Deacons fund and ensures that Black Rock Cares remains effective. Serving on this team are Lou Cubelli, Joe DeMarco, Tracey DuRivage, Gary Gulemi, Janet Jobst, Dawn Kerr, Michael Rao, Pete Schirmann, Mondel Teka, and Amparo Ulloa. An indication of commitment, team health, and unity is that the four members who are eligible to leave the team in May are returning for a second term.

I'm grateful for our key leaders, Judy Nesbitt and Sharon Lemke, our care coordinators, who served with great compassion and effectiveness last year. Sarah Harwood. administrative assistant, was a great resource as the care office contact and liaison with our volunteers. 
