That's the vision driving Mark Topazian's ministry. While his wife Janet teaches full-time, Mark trains Christian healthcare professionals to naturally and respectfully integrate their faith into everyday patient care through the *Saline Process*—a curriculum now spreading across Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, and beyond. In Ethiopia, local leaders are now leading the training themselves.

Recently, the Saline Process returned to the U.S. for the first time in over 25 years. Mark helped launch a new cohort of trainers with the Christian Medical and Dental Associations. One physician who took the training said, "It's become a consistent part of my practice... I've seen God do some crazy stuff." He described anxious patients finding peace after prayer, deeper trust through spiritual conversations, and even opportunities to share the gospel with those who are curious. From Africa to the U.S., the goal is the same: equipping doctors, nurses, and caregivers to offer not just excellent care—but soul-level hope.
